### **Luce Scholars Program**

Luce Scholars Program provides stipends and internships for eighteen young Americans to live and work in Asia each year.

Prizes for stays of two to three months in Germany in conjunction with independent senior thesis research, language or other summer course at a German university, internship/practicum at a German institution or company. Scholarships for undergraduate semester or academic year abroad (four to ten months at a German university).

### **Gates Cambridge Scholarship Program**

The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, through the Gates Cambridge Scholarship Program, sponsors two scholarships for study at Cambridge University. The affiliated study award supports up to three years of study leading to a second bachelors degree, while the other funds post-graduate study leading to a graduate degree. Tuition, fees, plus allowances for maintenance and travel are included in the award. Applicants are not limited to a single field of study.

### **British Marshall Scholarship**

British Marshall Scholarships fund two years of study in any field, leading to the receipt of a British university degree. These scholarships cover tuition, fees, travel and a stipend. They may be used at any British university at either the undergraduate or graduate level.

### **George J. Mitchell Scholarships**

George J. Mitchell Scholarships support a year of study at one of nine universities in the Republic of Ireland and Northern Ireland. The award covers tuition and room charges, and provides an \$11,000 stipend plus an allowance for travel in Ireland, the United Kingdom and Europe.

### **Rhodes Scholarships**

Rhodes Scholarships fund two to three years of graduate study in any field at Oxford University and include tuition, fees, travel, and a stipend. Thirty-two students from eight districts are chosen annually from the United States.

### **Russian-US Young Leadership Fellows Public Service Program**

The Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs of the U.S. Department of State (ECA) and International Research and Exchanges Board (IREX) sponsor the Russian-US Young Leadership Fellows Public Service Program (YLF). The YLF supports a year of study and experiential learning in the Russian Federation. Participants complete one year of non-degree academic study at a qualified university or college and volunteer for forty hours each month on public service projects. Fellows also receive internship experience and are eligible for externship funding.
