**The Bavarian American Center Professional Internship Program** is for graduate students in public administration, political science, or international relations.

**The Robert Bosch Foundation Fellowship Program** offers 9 month internships for 23-34 year olds to work in the federal government or private sector of Germany.

**Internship Program** is for seniors or graduates and arranges paid internships for 6-24 months in Germany or Singapore.

**Summer Internship Program in Germany** offers paid 3-month internships to juniors, seniors, and recent graduates.

**Summer Internship program in Turkey** offers paid 3-month internships to juniors, seniors, and recent graduates.

**Summer internship Program in Argentina** offers unpaid 3-month internships to juniors, seniors, and recent graduates or a combination 1-month spanish language course followed by a 2-month internship.
